DECEMBER PULPIT POST

"I love to tell the story; I'll sing this theme in glory and tell the old, old story of Jesus and his love."
Katherine Hankey

These are the words to the chorus of one of my favorite hymns *I Love to Tell the Story*. Katherine, the author who wrote these words describes this story as being really old. Not just an old story, but an old, old story. Even though she wrote these words over 150 years ago, the story was really old then as well. We often think of the story of Jesus beginning at Christmas at his birth, but the first words in the gospel of John reminds us that Jesus was the Word that was spoken when all creation was spoken into existence. So indeed, the story is old!

As this new year begins, my new year's resolution as your pastor is to tell you once again this old, old story of Jesus and his love. I have witnessed time and time again what the author of this hymn noticed as she describes in the verses. There are people of all ages who still have not heard the good news for the first time and there are people who can't wait to hear the old story repeated over and over. The story may be old but hearing what God has done for us through his son Jesus Christ is always good news. The good news is the message of salvation delivered in God's own holy word.

Those of you who have toddlers around you understand what it is like to hear a song over and over. Many of you know the words by heart to the song, *Let it Go* from the movie *Frozen*. Some of you might be all too familiar with the songs *The Wheels on the Bus* or *Itsy-Bitsy Spider* that toddlers never seem to get tired of hearing. I would have to admit that I am getting tired of hearing them and I'm hopeful that these songs won't be sung in heaven. Katherine Hankey envisions that we will not only be singing songs about Jesus and his love here on earth, but we will also be singing this theme in glory as well.

There may be someone you know who has not yet heard the gospel (good news) of Jesus Christ or has drifted away from hearing it. It is God's promise to you that in either case the old, old story will come alive when they hear it, and they will hunger and thirst to hear it again. I encourage you to invite someone this year to church that is in need of hearing this good news that never grows old.

New Technology people needed soon for alternating Sundays on Facebook Line, at least as a back-up.

Snow removal lined up for the winter! Cody Sundermann and Connor Wendland.

Grand piano was tuned before dedication.

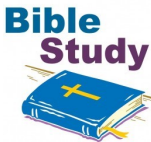

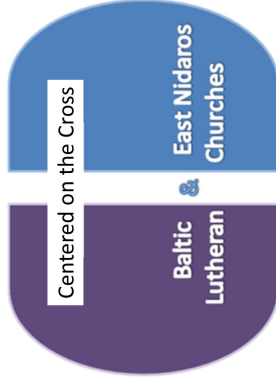
