October 2023 Pulpit Post "The Apocalypse"

The revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show his servants what must soon take place; he made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, who testified to the word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw.

Revelation 1:1

I took the opportunity to learn more about the book of Revelation at

the Fall Theological Conference that was recently held in Pierre in September. Dr. Barbara Rossing, who is a professor at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago and has authored many articles and books on the New Testament led this study. She began this study by encouraging us not to be afraid when preaching and teaching this final book in the bible despite the many scary and uncertain images that John testifies about from the visions that were revealed to him. The book of Revelation falls into the genre of bible literature described as "apocalyptic". Often our first impressions of this word is fear which can be fueled by the frightening messages given by the "Left Behind" book series. The word apocalypse simply means "the pulling back of the curtain" and as Christians we know as the "curtain" was already torn away when Jesus was crucified when he opened the gift of salvation to all believers. Jesus' death and resurrection should not leave us in fear but deliver us from fear to faith in Jesus Christ with the certain hope of eternal life.

Another wonderful outcome from the book of Revelation is that more hymns and liturgies for worship have come from the words that John was inspired to write in Revelation compared to any other book in the bible. The book of Revelation uses images of the tree of life and the river of life referring to Genesis where God's story all began. Revelation reminds us that Jesus is the beginning and the end, the first and the last. Jesus is the Alpha and Omega.

I hope you too may take the time to read this final book in the Bible. Read it without fear, but knowing what is most important. Jesus' return should be welcomed by believers, and it is the good news that we continue to proclaim to the world, so that we can say like John in his final words of Revelation "Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!" And now may the grace of the Lord Jesus be with all the saints. Amen. Pastor Randall J. Questad

Rick Fiala called the meeting to order, and Brett Teveldal opened the meeting in prayer.

State Farm representatives Bo Teveldal and Austin Hoflock were here to discuss insurance options for Baltic Lutheran Church. Current insurance policy with Grinnell would cover only the current value of the Church, not the value of a full replacement. $_{_{A}}$

State Farm policy offers full replacement of what a new church would cost at current market prices of materials. Grinnell holds only a 1% market share in South Dakota. Baltic Lutheran's policy has been increased on average about \$500 per year. State Farm would have a more consistent premium cost. Baltic Lutheran qualifies for a 20% discount on premium. State Farm policy would be about \$2500 more per year, but State Farm will e-mail a more specific quote to Brett Teveldal. Terry Snow recommended that the church have a trailer set up outside for aluminum cans. The cans could then be sold for money to support youth activities. Council will discuss at future meeting.

Pastor's Report

The church received a reminder from Bob's Piano Service Inc. about tuning the piano.


