<u>November 2022 Pulpit Post</u> "Changing Seasons"

As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day, and night, shall not cease. Genesis 8:22

These words were spoken by the Lord to Noah after the flood when he said that he would never again destroy the earth. The Lord has kept his promise and until Jesus comes again to establish a new heaven and a new earth we continue to plant and harvest, experience the heat of summer, the cold of winter, it continues to get dark at night and the sun comes up every morning.

The dramatic changing of seasons is often very evident as we transition from the month of October to November. We often see the beauty of this in the gorgeous colors of leaves on trees as summer comes to a close. We have recently experienced freezing temperatures that have shortened this season as trees drop these beautiful leaves. Lawns that were lush green now are also changing to brown for the winter months. It is not uncommon for the brown landscape to also be covered by white snow now that the temperatures are dropping. You might think the Lord had the South Dakota landscape in mind when he spoke about the difference in seasons to Noah as he got off the ark.

You can also witness the frequent changing of colors within our sanctuaries during this time of year. If you have never been on an altar committee, now is a good time to learn about the changing seasons of the church by how frequently the paraments in the church are changed.

After seeing the color of green during the long season of Pentecost, we know changes are coming as the paraments are changed to red on Reformation Sunday, the last Sunday of October. Then on the first Sunday of November the colors in the church change to white as we celebrate All Saints Sunday. Then they are replaced with green as the season of Pentecost ends for the year. This green is replaced with white for the last Sunday of the church year as we recognize Christ the King Sunday. November comes to an end with yet another color change as we begin to anticipate the birth of Jesus once again with the color blue as the season of Advent begins. As you will see, the colors that you see in our sanctuaries will be changing as often as the different seasons this time of year change the color of the landscape. One thing that never changes within the sanctuaries of this parish is God's unconditional words of forgiveness to you.

The monthly meeting of the Baltic Lutheran Church Council was held at Baltic Lutheran Church September 13, 2022. Serna, Jeff Boldt, and Bryce Witzel. Karen Sinding called the meeting to order.

Pastor Randall opened in prayer.

Diana Nohava made a motion to approve the August 16th meeting minutes, second by Al VanEck, motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Good news from doctor on hip surgery. Scheduled 2nd surgery for November 21st. Progression of VBS, Community Worship, and Joint Rally really works!

East Nidaros Council Minutes September 13, 2022

The monthly meeting of the East Nidaros Lutheran Church Council was held at East Nidaros Lutheran Church on September 13, 2022. Attendance: Connie Karl, Deb Larson, Alvina Harvey, Lori Kappler, Mark Brobjorg, Pastor Randall. Not present: David Dyce, David Daugaard, Jim Vollan, Jesse Harman.

Call to order: Connie Karl called the meeting to order Pastor Randall opened in Prayer

Motion by Deb Larson to approve the August 2022 meeting minutes and Alvina Harvey seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor's report: Recovering well from previous hip surgery. Pastor Randall is planning a 2nd hip surgery on Monday, November 21st. There will not be confirmation on November 23rd due to the Thanksgiving holiday. Pastor Randall felt Vacation Bible school along with the community worship in August followed by Rally Sunday in September works well together. Bible study started this week - East Nidaros will continue with Tuesdays at 2pm and Baltic will continue with Monday's at 6:30pm. Bible Study was held at East Nidaros on September 13th and was held at Baltic Lutheran on Monday, September 12th. Confirmation starts with an Orientation on September 14th at 6:30pm. There will be 9 pre-confirmation (6th grade) students and 18 confirmation (7th/8th grade) students from East Nidaros and Baltic Lutheran this year. 2 pre-confirmation and 11 confirmation students from East Nidaros. Kendra Kappler will be assisting Pastor Randall with confirmation this year. There will be a Northern Rim Youth Group meeting at Benton Lutheran on September 25th at 5pm. Installation of Sunday school teachers on

Sunday, September 18th during worship services. East Nidaros and Baltic Lutheran will be participating in the Baltic school homecoming parade on September 16th. Ordination for Katie Pauly on September 17th. Pastor Randall will be attending the Fall Theological Conference in Pierre starting Sunday evening September 18th through Tuesday, September 20th. Pastor Randall attending 1st call retreat in Chamberlin November 6th – 8th. East Nidaros and Baltic Lutheran churches will be serving the Banquet (west location) on October 12th – 6 volunteers are needed from 1-5pm for meal prep and 25 volunteers are needed from 5-8pm to serve the evening meal. The approximate cost to serve the Banquet is \$250 from East Nidaros. Deb Larson has asked the Hallelujah Hooligans to perform at the Banquet. Pastor Randall reminded council members to send Lisa Skelly (new administrative assistant) meeting minutes and bulletin reminders of specific dates.

Treasurer report: Financial report printed and presented to council members. Deb Larson has transferred \$10,000 back into General savings account – not needed in General checking at this time. Deb Larson looking into a budget line for the cost of QuickBooks and will be reporting back to the council later. Pastor Randall will be reimbursed for the Northern Rim Youth Trip expenses. Mark Brobjorg made the motion to approve the Treasurer report and seconded by Lori Kappler. Motion carried.

Deacon's report: Nothing new to report

<u>Trustee's report</u>: Discussed calling Pella to inspect sash on windows. Mark Brobjorg will contact Pella Window company.

<u>Old Business</u>: Roof leak in the sanctuary – Trustees looking into roofing options. Church attendance and decreased church offerings ongoing concern – Council continues to discuss potential ideas. Still actively seeking to fill Secretary and Deacon Council positions and needing Altar Committee volunteers. Alvina Harvey looking into potential volunteers for the Baptismal banners.

New Business: Discussed potentially taking out Workman's Compensation for wage earners at a cost of \$674 annually – Council will discuss more at budget time. Suspicion of rodents in the kitchen area of the church basement – traps were set. 2 volunteers are needed from East Nidaros to assist with the Foot care clinic which is held at Baltic Lutheran on the 1st Thursday every other month from 8:30am – 2:30pm, the next foot care clinic will be in October. Soup supper will be on November 6th from 4:30 – 6:00pm at East Nidaros – discussed planning meeting for this event.

Next Council Meeting: October 11th at 7pm

Motion to adjourn meeting was made by Deb Larson and seconded by Mark Brobjorg. Motion carried.
