# DECEMBER PULPIT POST

## *“Good News”*

**The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.**

***Mark 1:1***

As the month of December begins so does the start of a new church year. The church year begins with the Season of Advent, the season we often describe as a time of anticipation. During this new year, we will hear and learn about the life of Jesus from the gospel of Mark. Mark’s first words written are “the beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.”

What is this beginning according to Mark? It isn’t as most would expect. It is not the birth of Jesus Christ (which Mark omits from his gospel completely). It isn’t the baptism of Jesus which he briefly mentions. Mark describes the beginning of the “good news”, the gospel, as a promise that has been delivered through time by preachers who have been given God’s word. Mark quotes Malachi and Isaiah as prophets proclaiming that the preacher John the Baptist would prepare the way for Jesus. The promise of the arrival of Jesus was delivered long before the words of these prophets as this beginning of good news was first delivered in the beginning of the bible in Genesis 3 when it was promised that a seed from Eve would one day destroy Satan.

As this new year begins, it is good to start at the beginning and retell the story of Jesus. Starting even before his birth. Starting with a promise that has never wavered from when it was first told as soon as creation was completed. I look forward to once again retelling these stories of Jesus this year from the gospel of Mark. Katherine Hankey wrote the text for the familiar hymn “I Love to tell the Story” which beautifully describes why we start at the beginning and tell this story over and over. We retell it for some have never heard. We retell it because it sounds just as sweet for those who know it best. We retell it because we know it’s true. We retell it because nothing else satisfies like the story of Jesus and the love he has for you.

The waiting is over. The good news is here.

# Parish Nurse & Health Board

Now that Advent Season is here and we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ, the many “normal” activities we do will be much different this year with the COVID Pandemic. The “Holiday Stress” we usually experience will be very different with not being able to spend time with our families and friends and with the Sunday School programs and other Christmas programs not taking place. So obviously one of the stressors will be sadness or depression.

I did come across an old article I had on Pandemics—Expect the Unexpected—Plan for a change in routines. Interestingly things recommended to do then are the same as now. 1) stay healthy as we can, (2) wash hands, (3) use proper hygiene, (4) wear a mask, (5) wear gloves when needed, (6) keep home and work areas clean, (7) stay informed.

Pandemics are not new- as there have been three in the last century.

\*1918-19 – This outbreak of what was called the Spanish flu was linked to avian influenza, as is the current pandemic threat. It caused an estimated 50 million deaths worldwide. An unusual aspect of this flu was that death rates were high among healthy young adults as well as the usual high-risk groups.

\*1957-58 – This pandemic was caused by a flu called Asian flu. It was moderately severe and caused up to 2 million deaths worldwide.

\*1968-69 – An influenza called Hong Kong flu caused this pandemic which claimed 700,000 deaths worldwide.

Death rates varied among these pandemics for a number of reasons, including differences in viruses involved and the timing of the outbreaks. There have also been several pandemic threats- of swine flu in 1976, Russian flu in 1977, avian flu, and now the COVI-19.

Changing the subject, we also need to be aware of the effects of the winter season on our blood pressure, as winter has a way of making blood pressure go up, as the colder temperatures cause blood vessels to constrict making the heart work harder to pump blood through the narrow arteries. This can cause the blood pressure to go up. Weight and exercise are also factors as we tend to lose weight in the summer with more exercise while the winter months are the reverse with weight gain and less exercise. Blood pressure rises with weight gain and decreases

with weight loss, so maintaining your weight with exercise will benefit in keeping blood pressure within normal limits. Unfortunately, we have not been doing the Check'n on the Second during this time, but hopefully, you will have other means of checking it often.

As of now, we are planning on having the Service of Remembrance on December 19 for anyone to come in Remembrance of a loved one. This is a beautiful service, so I pray we will be able to hold it.

The next Foot Care Clinic is December 3 and at this time we have no openings, but please call me if needing to be seen. As always, masks are required, along with social distancing.

Merry Christmas and I leave you with this prayer this month, As I live each day may I do my part to make one difference, to touch one heart And through each day may it be my goal to encourage one mind, and inspire one soul.

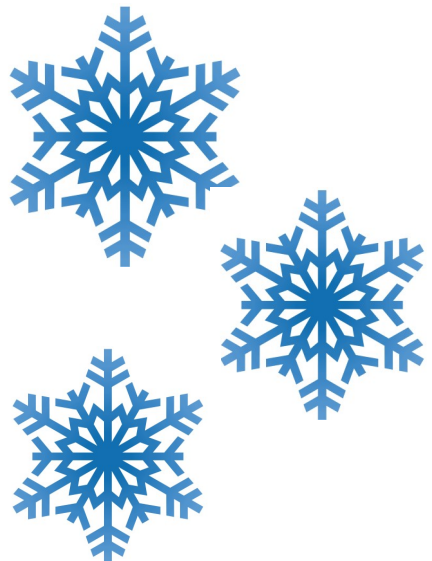

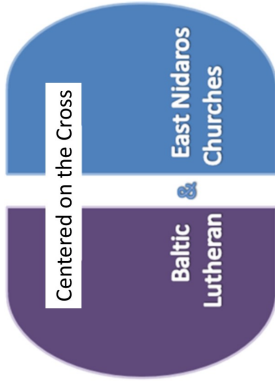
