"All In"

The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it. Psalm 24:1

Memorize this short verse. It may change how you look at everything you do. This was the central theme of the Confirmation Camp that several of our 7th and 8th grade students experienced at the Okoboji Youth Recharge Camp in November.

These words are a simple, but powerful way to look at stewardship. Most often when we talk about stewardship, the first thing that often comes to our minds is money. Of course, you have heard it enough that you also know that stewardship deals with how and where we also spend our time and our talents. But whether it is money, time, or talents, all these sound like you are being asked to do more or to go "all in".

This verse refocuses where stewardship begins. It doesn't begin with what we should do with what is ours. Instead, it informs us that everything that we have is not ours to begin with. Instead, God is "all in" for you by entrusting you to be a good steward of what was his from the beginning. Removing you from being the giver of what you have to the Lord who has given you everything you have will change our mindset from fear of running out to the freedom to give generously. Camp counselors taught these youth several practical examples of what this looks like in their lives. When God is just one of the many important things that revolve around them, God gets some of their attention when it is convenient. However, when God is in the center of all we do, we will include him in "all" things. Students were invited to consider what they might do differently with their friends, family, schoolwork, and activities knowing that they were gifts from God to begin with.

This verse was not meant just for youth. In fact, the more we have, the more we likely need to be reminded that the earth is the Lord's and everything in it. The church gives us many opportunities to be stewards of what the Lord has given us to give to others.

The Lord is "all in" for you, let us respond by being "all in" with the good gifts that we have received.

May God's peace be with you, and I pray you have a Merry Christmas, Pastor Randall J. Questad

The monthly meeting of the East Nidaros Council was held at East Nidaros Lutheran Church on October 11, 2022. Attendance: Mark Brobjorg, Connie Karl, Deb Larson, Alvina Harvey, Rosalie Brende, Jim Vollan, Lori Kappler, Pastor Randall Questad. Not Present: Jesse Hartman, David Dyce.

Call to Order: Connie Karl called the meeting to order
Pastor Randall Opened with Prayer and Scripture Reading
Motion by Mark Brobjorg to approve the September 2022 meeting
minutes, and Deb Larson seconded, Motion Carried.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Baltic and East Nidaros Churches along with the Confirmation students will be serving the Banquet (west location) on October 12th and the Hallelujah Hooligans will be performing. Plan to continue serving the Banquet annually.

Pastor Randall attending the 1st Call Retreat in Chamberlin November 6th – 8th.

Pastor Randall, Kendra Kappler, and the Confirmation students will be attending a Youth Recharge Camp in Okoboji November $11^{th}-13^{th}$ (Camp starts on Friday night and will conclude at noon on Sunday.) The theme for the camp is "All In" Pastor Randall has rented a van for transportation. Reid Christopherson will be leading worship services on Sunday, November 13th.

Introduction to Confirmation class with 6th grade (10 students) on Wednesday, October 5th.

Pastor Randall planning second hip surgery on November 21st.

<u>Treasurer' Report:</u> Financial report printed and presented to Council members. Church offerings have increased. Propane estimate has increased this year. Deb Larson requesting to buy a computerized Carbonite back up program for QuickBooks at a cost of \$67.19. Jim Vollan made a motion to approve \$67.19 for the backup program and seconded by Alvina Harvey, Motion carried. Mark Brobjorg made a motion to approve the Treasurer Report and Lori Kappler seconded, Motion Carried.

<u>Deacon's Report:</u> Rosalie Brende has joined the Church Council as a Deacon.

<u>Trustee's Report:</u> David Daugaard emailed pictures from inside the church bell tower, wood rotting and gaps around edges that need to be caulked from the outside and interior roof needs attention for resealing – David Daugaard checking into a contracting company to get this fixed. David Daugaard has patched missing shingles on church roof, filled in gaps in the Sunday School rooms to prevent mice and bats entering the ceiling.

Mark Brobjorg has contacted and left message for Pella to inspect sash on the windows.

Mark Brobjorg changed the furnace filters and should be good to go for winter.

<u>Old Business:</u> Soup supper will be held at East Nidaros Lutheran Church on November 6th. Soup supper planning meeting was held on October 4th at East Nidaros.

<u>New Business:</u> Budget meeting was held on October 11th – Discussed potentially taking out Workman's compensation for wage earners – Deb Larson will continue to research.

Deb Larson asked the Council to actively seek a new Church Treasurer. Council discussed hiring a potential accounting firm or an Individual Certified Public Accountant. Rosalie Brende will contact a potential accountant she knows, and Deb Larson will contact KMWF accountants in Dell Rapids for bookkeeping estimates. Estimates will be reported back to the council via email.

Baptism for Rowdy Rick on November 20th. Alvina Harvey will check on Baptismal banner.

Motion was made by Alvina Harvey to designate Thanksgiving offering to Disaster Relief for Hurricane Ian. Mark Brobjorg seconded; Motion carried.

Next Council meeting will be held at East Nidaros on November 15 with Baltic. Individual meeting at 6pm and Joint meeting at 7pm.

Connie Karl called the meeting to order.

Katie Chapman from Shetek Lutheran Ministries gave a presentation.

The minutes from the last meeting on August 16, 2022, were emailed. Motion by Deb Larson, second by Myron Nohava to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

Financial Report:

Discussed/Reviewed Joint Church expenses – Joint expenses will be based on confirmed members from each church. Baltic Lutheran will pay 60% and East Nidaros will pay 40% for the following: Pastor Salary, Postage Master, Office Depot, Portals of Prayer, and Concordia Publishing.

Baltic Lutheran will pay 50% and East Nidaros will pay 50% for the following: Alliance, New Century Press, Access Systems, Sundays in Seasons Liturgy and Pulpit Supply.

Motion by Diana Nohava to approve the Joint Church expenses and seconded by Myron Nohava. Motion carried

Discussed Salaries and Compensation – Motion was made by Myron Nohava to leave Pastor's salary the same as last year and seconded by Mark Brobjorg, Motion carried.

New Business:

Annual Meeting Date will be January 22, 2023, following church services. In the event of inclement weather, the meeting would be held on January 29th. Annual Reports need to be turned into the Administrative Assistant by January 2, 2023.

Discussed having one joint church service on Christmas Day this year (2022) and one joint Christmas Eve service in 2023. A joint Christmas Day service will be held in Baltic at 10am this year and a joint Christmas Eve Service will be held at East Nidaros in 2023. Deb Larson made the motion to approve the joint services and Myron Nohava seconded. Motion carried.

Next Foot Care Clinic will be on February 9th at Baltic Lutheran Church. Need two volunteers from East Nidaros.

Next Joint Council Meeting will be early February 2023. Motion by John Sinding, seconded by David Dyce to adjourn the meeting. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.
