I will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down, says the Lord God. I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, but the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them with justice. Ezekiel 34:15-16

I think this is the second time since I have been a pastor that the season of Lent begins on Valentine's Day. Not really a bad idea on the day that we give gifts and cards that have hearts on them that we also gather together to be reminded that Christ has come to create new hearts in us.




