"He Fasted"

Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished. Matthew 4:1-2

This verse from Matthew describes the period of time when Jesus was tempted in the wilderness by Satan immediately after Jesus had been baptized. This verse also has been used as the reference for why we observe the Season of Lent. We are told that Jesus fasted for 40 days and nights and after this period of time, Jesus was hungry. This is why we count back from Easter Sunday a period of about 40 days and mark Ash Wednesday as the beginning of the Season of Lent. On this day we receive a cross of ashes on our foreheads and hear the words, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." These words were first spoken to Adam after the "Fall" as recorded in the third chapter of Genesis.

Unfortunately, this season of Lent, for many, has become a period of time when we feel we should imitate Jesus and give up something or do something more. Man's desire to be like God was the first man's sin and still is ours today. We desire to be the Creator rather than be the

creatures, God made us to be. If we want to experience the fullness of Easter and what Jesus has done for us by his resurrection, we should also allow the Season of Lent to also be focused on Jesus rather than us and what we can do to better ourselves. During the season of Lent, just like any other day or season of the year, we need to be fed by the words of Jesus rather fast and be left hungering for what we need most.

Martin Luther suggested that if you want to do something during the season of Lent, a good idea would be to study the catechism. Then you will be "doing" something, but through your review or study of the

catechism, you will be reminded of what God is doing for you. If you do not have a copy of Luther's Small Catechism and would like this to be your "discipline" during Lent, contact the church office and we can

provide you with a copy of this. In Luther's teaching of the Lord's

Supper in the Small Catechism, he states that fasting and outward

preparations serve a good purpose in preparing to receive the Lord's supper, but far more important is believing that your sins are forgiven.

It is my hope and prayer that during this season of Lent that believing in Jesus will be your focus. Please join us in our Mid-week services as we are reminded that it is God who feeds, unites, teaches, sends, and saves us as we live our "Lives of Faith".


