#### April 2023 Pulpit Post "God Gave"

6 I planted, Apollos watered, but <u>God gave</u> the growth. 7 So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters are anything, but only God who gives the growth. 8 The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each.

#### 1 Corinthians 3:6-8

After one of the most challenging winters that we have experienced in many years, I think just about everyone is ready for a change in seasons. According to the calendar, Spring has arrived. While there are still piles of snow in our yards and in the ditches, they are starting to slowly shrink away and there is evidence that this long-awaited spring is once again on its way.

The changing seasons is just one more thing that we desire so much to control in our lives.

The apostle Paul, who recorded these words from 1 Corinthians, spent much of his life believing that he was in control of his actions, and he could also control those around him. He maintained this belief until

God has given to each of us this same purpose of sharing this good news to people who have been waiting for a change in their hearts and lives. Easter is a great opportunity for you to invite someone you know to one of our Easter services so that they can hear this good news too. You can be like Paul and plant the seed. Then trust in God the Giver who will give the growth.
