May 2023 Pulpit Post "Easter People"

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, tothebreakingofbreadandtheprayers.Acts 2:42

We are not only still in the season of Easter in the month of May, but we are to be living every day as Easter people since Jesus Christ is risen. But what does this mean? This was the same question that the first believers asked who came to Peter as recorded in the book of Acts. They asked, "What should we do?" Peter responded to them, "Be baptized, every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Peter's answer to their question describes our purpose as a church and what we are to do.

We of course believe as Easter people there is nothing more for us to do regarding our salvation. Jesus accomplished everything by his death on the cross and his rising from the grave. When Jesus said, "It is finished.", he meant exactly what he said. In the highlighted verse for this Pulpit Post, Peter describes what the Easter people did next. The newly baptized were taught, engaged in fellowship, received the Lord's supper and prayer.

This may sound like a job description of the church, but Peter said that as a church they were devoted to this calling as Easter people. This was simply a fruit that was produced after the first Easter and the devotion of God's chosen people to do these things as a church continues today. If we wonder what we are to do as church today, we need to be reminded of what Jesus has done for us and how we as a church will deliver this good news to people by providing worship services that freely share this good news. We are to provide opportunities of fellowship so that we can listen to the needs of our neighbors. We are to provide the Sacraments to proclaim that their sins are forgiven. And we are to be a house of prayer.

Let us continue to be devoted to what Jesus has called us as Easter people to do as a church.

Christ is Risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia


